TULIPWOOD



Many crafters are used to working with wood flooring, but recognize that there are times when certain jobs can be made with secondary wood. It is in these times that comes into action the tulip tree wood, fine texture wood, consistent and relatively low price.

Type: hardwoods of the temperate zone

Other names: Yellow choupo, magnolia choupo tree

Alternatives: Kauri (Agathis sp.), Red Alder (Alnus rubra), pine of Parana (Araucaria angustifolia), hoop pine (arauria cunninghamii)

Origin: Europe

Color: White cream with tracks in light tones of green, brown, red and blue that darken with age into a honey color

Texture: uniform and Fina

Wood grain: Straight

Hardness: bland and fibrous consistency

Weight: Medium (500Kg/m3)

Resistance: Moderate

Drying and stability: The terminal may be too wide. Dries well and quickly without damage, and is stable after drying.

Degree of waste: High in the case of wanting to avoid the colored bands and terminal. Low when you want to use wood for utilities.

Width of the parts: Good

The thickness of the parts: Good
